I can't quite believe we are beginning the summer term already! Topics

This term we will continue with our individualised curriculum, tailored to the children's interests and motivations, to teach individualised skills. Our broad theme, therefore, will be 'Fantastic Beasts and How We're Similar', which will explore animal taxonomy, functions of the human body and how to look after it.

We will also begin preparations for our sharing and leavers assemblies, which will involve us reflecting back on our learning this year and using our digital skills to plan, create and edit short films, photo montages etc.
